



To help us streamline this process and organize these ideas, the Town secured WSP as a consultant to work alongside the Heritage Committee to form the Heritage Plan.





We are in the preliminary stages of forming a Business Advisory Committee in the Town of Stellarton!

This committee will be comprised of local business owners and identified staff and will be beneficial in connecting businesses with one another, as well as with the Town. The goal of this committee is to build better relationships within the business community, offer better communication between the Town and businesses, and further develop opportunities for businesses and residents alike.

Accessibility Committee

The Accessibility Committee has been hard at work developing a plan to increase accessibility in the Town. We have an obligation to be fully accessible by 2030 and this committee will help us navigate our top priorities.

We will begin by retrofitting Town Hall to ensure that it is fully accessible to every Stellarton resident, regardless of their ability. Then, we will begin on our five key areas: Built Environment, Information & Communications, Goods & Services, Transportation, and Employment.



that the warmth and light of the sun has not forgotten us. On this solstice, we have an extra treat, a real Christmas Star, the first one in 800 years. The solar systems two largest planets, Jupiter and Saturn, will align and shine as one star in our Christmas sky. Very cool.

Council and I feel as though we received our Christmas present early, October 17th to be exact. We worked hard for four years, made tough decisions, and realized improvements to our town. Further to that, we really enjoyed representing you at the municipal level of government. That is why we are all so pleased to have four more years in office, to serve your interests. The council members have built up a trust and respect for each other over our first four years, we are all happy to continue to work together, for your benefit.

We are seeing growth in the Albion Business Park, great news for our town. Petro Canada and associated businesses are hoping to be open mid-February. Self-Storage units (across from Anchor Toyota) will be the next structure to go up. They have submitted their documents to our planning department, and a sign is up advertising their business. In addition, the Town of Stellarton donated a parcel of land in the park to the SPCA. They will build a modern facility that serves Pictou, Antigonish and Colchester Counties. It will draw people to our park and provide property tax revenue to the town. Also important to recognize, with a new top-notch facility, three counties in Northern Nova Scotia will feel the full benefit of the SPCA mission: "The SPCA is dedicated to the prevention of cruelty to animals and to the promotion of respect and humane care for animals. Its members are committed to providing humane leadership in animal advocacy, protection, education, and veterinary care."



As winter passes and we move into spring, a new bus service will launch. It will be the first public transit in our town (and county) since 1996. The name is Pictou County Transit, a one-hour fixed route (loop) around Stellarton and New Glasgow. We called it Pictou County Transit in hopes other municipalities will join after the three-year pilot project is complete. The Province of Nova Scotia recognizes the importance of public transit in rural areas and are putting their money where their mouth is, investing \$200,000 to buy the bus, and another \$200,000 for the first year of operations. The Town of Stellarton's commitment is \$50,000 in year two and \$50,000 in year three of the pilot project. New Glasgow's contribution is essentially double that, the funding formula is based on population and kilometers of the route in each town.

We all know what kind of year 2020 was for our province, our country, and the world. Our region is doing better than most. Let us continue to stay safe, while recognizing 2021 will be a better year for all. It is always darkest just before the dawn, perhaps 2020 was the darkness and 2021 will bring us a new dawn.


Communications Plan


At Council on December 14, 2020, Stellarton Town Council approved, in principle, a Communications Plan prepared by the Marketing and Communications Coordinator.


